Cambridge International Examinations is the world's largest provider of international education programmes and qualifications for 5–19 year olds. Their qualifications are taken in over 160 countries and recognised by universities, education providers and employers across the world.

How will The Lighthouse offer this qualification?

We begin our high school curriculum with *Cambridge Checkpoint 7, 8 and 9* which we complete over two years. During these two years, subjects are English, Afrikaans, Maths and Science.

The next stage is *Cambridge IGCSE*, during which we do English, Afrikaans, Mathematics and at least three optional subjects.

The final year is *AS-levels* when the learner chooses subjects from the table below.

What about exams?

Checkpoint exams will be internal exams written at school and will be used to determine whether a learner is ready to progress to IGCSE level.

IGCSE, AS and A-levels will be external exams and an examination fee will apply for each subject written. We are a Cambridge International School and write the exams at our school. What will it cost?

School fees, excluding text books, are *R4300 per month*, payable over 12 months. Examination fees will be payable to register for each IGCSE and AS-level exam. These currently range *from R2750 to R4250* per subject.
